Two major Reports, in one volume (a two-volume version is also sometimes found). Ashbee was Civic Advisor to the City of Jerusalem and makes by far the largest contribution to these Reports; the second being mainly his important plan for the city. His close involvement can also be seen in the beautiful layout and design of this volume. Rare.

A beautifully produced planning study - in the same style as the British Isles 1940s reconstruction plans. The Plan seems to imply a neighbourhood unit approach, as well as some new roads and open spaces, The Plan is also useful for the information it gives on earlier attempts to plan the city (by McLean, Geddes, the Pro-Jerusalem Society etc).

A rare reconstruction plan. Berg was the city's Chief Architect. As the title suggests, he sees the enormous wartime destruction of Cologne as an unrepeatable opportunity for comprehensive replanning.

Detailed planning study of the city, with many large-scale proposals. Schumacher directed the replanning of the city during leave of absence (1920-1923) from his post as Chief Architect of Hamburg. This fine work confirms Schumacher's status as one of the great European city planners of the early twentieth century.

Edward Bennett's great beaux arts 'city beautiful' plan. It developed from the need to build a new federal building in the city. This led in turn to the idea of a new civic centre area and eventually to pressure for an entire city plan. Bennett produced a preliminary plan in 1911, followed by this comprehensive plan in 1917. Examples of good practice from Europe and other places are much quoted. Bennett had been co-producer with Burnham of the great Chicago Plan and the present fine work is of almost comparable quality.

A New Federal Capital

The well-known Holt Plan for the Federal Capital. Ottawa had been so designated in 1858, but continued to be a rather mediocre Ontario backwater. The nation's capital needed to be a far more edifying city (Washington was an obvious comparison). The Plan provides for a city of 250,00 people with dignified vistas and great new thoroughfares, such as Laurier Avenue. Roads and railways should be grade

separated. There are also many new city parks, as well as new open spaces around the government buildings.

A rare Planning Report for the country (now mainly Israel, but also some of the West Bank) under the British Mandate. The Town Planning Adviser was H. Kendall, a notable British Town Planner of the period (see also Jerusalem entry below). Included are valuable plans for Jerusalem (Mount of Olives area), Haifa, Gaza, Tel Aviv, Jaffa etc.. Fascinating item.

The Parc de La Villette in north-east Paris was a radical approach to urban park design. This work describes the background to the Competition and the various entries. The jury was headed by Burle-Marx. The winning design by Bernard Tschumi is discussed in detail, and there is an interview with him. Others on the short-list included Lassus, OMA and Chermayeff. These and other entries are described and illustrated. The Parc is very popular with today's Parisians. [All texts in French and English]

Kenzo Tange from Tokyo and Micevic Radovan & Wenzler Fedor from Zagreb shared the competition prize for reconstruction of the City Centre.

A detailed plan for this Argentine city, capital of the province of the same name. Angel Guido, an architect and civil engineer, was Professor at the Universidad Nacional del Litoral. His plan is conceived on Beaux Art principles, with grand avenidas, zoning blocks, street layouts, traffic plans etc. There is also good material on the previous planning history of this city. A rare city plan and nice item.

A very interesting, if quite depressing, account of the various plans for the city in this period. The Nazis produced a number of schemes, imposing their will on the city. There is also material on the Warsaw ghetto and local concentration camps plus a more hopeful section on the beginning of reconstruction planning after the war.

He had been President of the TPI, and was responsible for some other important town plans, including Blaydon c1933, Macclesfield, 1944 and Aberdeen and Dundee, 1952.
